<u>Subject:</u> August 2002 Core Procurement Charge and Core Subscription Procurement Charge Updates

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment B.

This filing is made in compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of D.98-07-068, dated July 23, 1998.

Purpose:

This is the first combined filing revising the listed tariff rate schedules by updating both the Core Procurement Charge for residential and core commercial and industrial customers, and the retail and wholesale Core Subscription Procurement Charges for August 2002.

Core Procurement Charge Update:

Decision No. (D.) 98-07-068 authorizes SoCalGas to 1) change the calculation of its forecasted portfolio weighted average cost of gas using best estimates of the weighted volumes and prices of flowing supplies from the different supply basins delivered to the California/Arizona border for the purposes of calculating its Core Procurement Charge, 2) file the Core Procurement Charge tariffs on the last business day of each month to become effective on the first calendar day of the following month, and 3) establish a Core Purchased Gas Account (CPGA) imbalance band of ±1% of the actual annual commodity gas purchases for the preceding 12-month period ending March 31 of each year, wherein adjustments would be made to the Core Procurement Charge only if the CPGA imbalance falls outside of such band.

For residential and core commercial and industrial customers the August 2002 Core Procurement Charge is 28.455¢ per therm, a decrease of 1.632¢ per therm from last month.

Core Subscription Procurement Charge Update:

D. 98-07-068 authorizes SoCalGas to 1) change the calculation of its forecasted portfolio weighted average cost of gas using best estimates of the weighted volumes and prices of flowing supplies from the different supply basins delivered to the California/Arizona border for the purposes of calculating its Core Subscription Procurement Charge, and 2) file the Core Subscription Procurement Charge tariffs on the last business day of each month to become effective on the first calendar day of the following month.

For August 2002, the retail Core Subscription Procurement Charge is 16.892¢ per therm, a decrease of 1.938¢ per therm from last month. The wholesale Core Subscription Procurement Charge is 16.811¢ per therm, a decrease of 1.929¢ per therm from last month. The workpaper showing details of the calculation of these rates is incorporated herein as Attachment C.

Both the retail and wholesale Core Subscription Procurement Charges include a credit that SoCalGas intends to apply over the next month (August 2002) in order to reduce a current overcollection in the core subscription account.

Pursuant to SoCalGas' 1999 BCAP Decision No. 00-04-060 the fixed monthly Core Subscription Reservation Charge has been replaced with a volumetric-based reservation charge, which currently is 3.382¢ per therm, effective January 1, 2002, as filed by SoCalGas Advice No. 3096.

The August 2002 Buy-Back Rates, as contained in Schedule No. G-IMB, Transportation Imbalance Service, will be filed at the end August 2002 by separate advice letter.

Pursuant to Resolution G-3316, the Schedule No. G-IMB Standby Procurement Charges for August 2002 will be filed at least one day prior to September 25, 2002 by separate advice letter.

Protest

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
