Subject: August 2004 Core Procurement Charge Update

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment B.

This filing is made in compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 2 and 3 of Decision No. (D.) 98-07-068, dated July 23, 1998.

Purpose

This filing revises the listed tariff rate schedules by updating the Core Procurement Charge for residential and core commercial and industrial customers for August 2004.

Background

D.98-07-068 authorizes SoCalGas to 1) change the calculation of its forecasted portfolio weighted average cost of gas using best estimates of the weighted volumes and prices of flowing supplies from the different supply basins delivered to the California/Arizona border for the purposes of calculating its Core Procurement Charge, 2) file the Core Procurement Charge tariffs on the last business day of each month to become effective on the first calendar day of the following month, and 3) establish a Core Purchased Gas Account (CPGA) imbalance band of $\pm 1\%$ of the actual annual commodity gas purchases for the preceding 12-month period ending March 31 of each year, wherein adjustments would be made to the Core Procurement Charge only if the CPGA imbalance falls outside of such band.

For residential and core commercial and industrial customers the August 2004 Core Procurement Charge is 55.832¢ per therm, a decrease of 2.977¢ per therm from last month. The Adjusted Core Procurement Charge (G-CPA) reported in Schedule No. G-CP, which is used as an equivalent to the previously reported Core Subscription Procurement Charge, for August 2004 is 55.631¢ per therm, a decrease of 2.977¢ per therm from last month.

Protest

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
