**Subject: Updates to SoCalGas' 2006, 2007 and 2008 Capacity Planning Ranges
Based on the 2006 California Gas Report**

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Decision No. (D.) 04-09-022, Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for Commission approval an update of SoCalGas' 2006, 2007 and 2008 capacity planning ranges based on the forecasts in the 2006 California Gas Report (2006 CGR).

Purpose

This filing updates SoCalGas' capacity planning ranges for 2006, 2007 and 2008 based on the 2006 CGR. In compliance with D.04-09-022, SoCalGas is updating its 2006 capacity planning range to 1,001 MMcfd – 1,201 MMcfd effective October 1, 2006 through March 31, 2007. For the period April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008, SoCalGas is updating the capacity planning range to 997 MMcfd – 1196 MMcfd. For the period April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2009, SoCalGas is updating the capacity planning range to 999 MMcfd – 1198 MMcfd.

Background

D.04-09-022, was issued, in part, to address the proposal of SoCalGas, filed in compliance with R.04-01-025, to acquire capacity holdings in a more efficient and cost-effective manner. In D.04-09-022, the Commission approved new capacity contracting procedures for SoCalGas. Pursuant to these capacity contracting procedures, SoCalGas is to acquire firm interstate capacity that on an annual average basis ranges between 100-120% of SoCalGas' core procurement customers' annual average daily load.¹

D.04-09-022 determined that the capacity planning range for SoCalGas is to reflect forecasted demand in the following manner: "[t]he forecasted demand will either be from

the latest filed BCAP or the latest California Gas Report, if the BCAP is more than 12 months old.”²

D.04-09-022 established an initial capacity planning range for 2006 of 1,049 MMcfd-1,258 MMcfd, based upon forecasts available at that time.³ On July 1, 2006, the 2006 CGR was submitted to the Commission, and SoCalGas’ last filed BCAP is more than 12 months old. Accordingly, in compliance with Commission’s direction in D.04-09-022, SoCalGas hereby updates its capacity planning ranges for 2006, 2007 and 2008 based upon the revised core procurement load forecasts presented in the 2006 CGR.

Consistent with the 2006 CGR forecast of SoCalGas’ core procurement customer demand, SoCalGas hereby changes its 2006 core forecasted average temperature year daily demand to 1,001 MMcfd, and its 2006 capacity planning range to 1,001 MMcfd – 1,201 MMcfd effective October 1, 2006 through March 31, 2007. SoCalGas hereby changes its 2007 core forecasted average temperature year daily demand to 997 MMcfd and its 2007 capacity planning range to 997 MMcfd – 1196 MMcfd effective April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008. SoCalGas hereby changes its 2008 core forecasted average temperature year daily demand to 999 MMcfd and its 2008 capacity planning range to 999 MMcfd – 1198 MMcfd effective April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2009.

This filing will not create any deviations from SoCalGas’ tariffs, cause withdrawal of service from any present customer, or impose any more or less restrictive conditions.

Effective Date

SoCalGas respectfully requests that this compliance filing become effective on September 29, 2006, which is 30 calendar days after the date filed.

Protests

Anyone may protest this advice letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and received within 20 days of the date this advice letter was filed with the Commission. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
