Subject: Self Generation Incentive Program Fund Reallocation Request

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) this advice letter requesting authority to reallocate Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) funds described in Decision (D.) 01-03-073 and D.04-12-045.

Purpose

This filing requests Commission authority to allow SoCalGas to reallocate SGIP budget dollars from the Level 2 Renewable category to the Level 3 Non-Renewable category. This reallocation will maximize the amount of new self-generation capacity installed for the 2007 program year, while still leaving a substantial amount of Level 2 dollars to roll-over to the 2008 program year.

Background

On March 27, 2001 the Commission issued D.01-03-073 adopting new utility programs to reduce demand for electricity through load control and distributed self-generation initiatives. Furthermore, D.01-03-073 requires the program administrators to seek approval through advice letter prior to shifting funds from a renewable into a non-renewable category (D.01-03-073, pp. 20-21). This advice letter seeks such approval.

On February 7, 2002 the Commission issued D.02-02-026 wherein it clarifies rules related to the carry-over of funds between program years. Specifically, the Commission declared the program administrators should carry over any unused funding from one year to the next (D.02-02-026, p. 16). Following this directive, SoCalGas has continually rolled-over unused funds from one program year to the next; keeping the unused funds within the program level they were originally assigned.

On December 14, 2006 the Commission issued D.06-12-033 stating "...we direct SoCalGas to carryover any unspent 2006 SGIP Level 1 funds to its 2007 SGIP renewable

budget." (p. 33) This renewable budget was Level 2. And, "SoCalGas should transfer any unspent 2006 SGIP solar funds into its 2007 SGIP renewable budgets." (Finding of Fact No. 32)

On January 31, 2008 the Commission issued D.08-01-029 that set the 2008 SGIP budget and stated "[a]ny unspent SGIP non-PV funds from prior budget years shall carry over into 2008 and beyond and be available for SGIP project funding until the end of the SGIP or until further Commission order." (p. 7)

Reason for Request to Shift SGIP Funds from Level 2 to Level 3

Assembly Bill 2778 (approved by the Governor on September 29, 2006) made Internal Combustion Engines and Microturbines ineligible for SGIP incentives effective January 1, 2008. As a result, SoCalGas was inundated with this type of funding requests in December 2007. These requests exceeded the Level 3 budget and created a waiting list for Level 3 non-renewable projects, see Table below. Since there is no funding for these projects in 2008, it is highly unlikely these projects will ever get funded unless funds are moved from Level 2 to Level 3.

Based on the foregoing, SoCalGas is requesting permission to move \$1.928 million from Level 2 renewable funds into Level 3 non-renewable funds. If granted, this still leaves \$35.5 million in funding to roll-over into SoCalGas' 2008 Level 2 SGIP budget.
