**Subject: Expedited Advice Letter Approval for Canadian Pipeline Capacity
Contracts Renewal – Decision 04-09-022**

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) respectfully requests California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) authorization to renew for one year the following existing transportation capacity contracts: one Trans-Canada Foothills– B.C. System – Zone 8 contract, and three Nova Gas Transmission Ltd. contracts.

Purpose

The purpose of this expedited advice letter is to request approval by the Commission to renew for a one-year term four existing Canadian transportation capacity contracts described below.¹ These contracts are used to transport natural gas supplies from Canada on behalf of SoCalGas' core gas customers.

Background

D.04-09-022 was issued, in part, to address the Phase I proposal of SoCalGas, filed in compliance with R.04-01-025, on new capacity contracting procedures that allowed for the utility to acquire core capacity in a more efficient and cost effective manner. The Commission approved procedures for capacity contract approval that rely on consultation between SoCalGas, Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA), The Utility Reform Network (TURN), and the Energy Division for all commitments for interstate capacity.

Under the interstate capacity acquisition procedure approved in D.04-09-022, contracts for interstate capacity supported by DRA and TURN may be submitted for approval to the Commission by an Expedited Advice Letter. DRA and TURN have authorized SoCalGas to state that they support this one-year renewal request for four existing Canadian transportation contracts.

Description of Contracts

SoCalGas purchases natural gas from Canada's Western Canadian production basin. These capacity contract renewals are being made to assure that the Canadian pipeline path is maintained for deliveries of gas from the Western Canadian production basin to the Kingsgate, British Columbia, Canada, receipt point of the Gas Transmission Northwest Corporation (GTN) pipeline system.

SoCalGas requests to extend the following three Nova Gas Transmission, Ltd. (NOVA) contracts: 17,582 Dth/d; 22,150 Dth/d; 3,448 Dth/d. The total amount for the three contracts is 43,180 Dth/d. All three contracts expire by October 31, 2009.

Also, SoCalGas requests to extend Foothills Pipe Lines Ltd. (Foothills) contract for 53,820 Dth/d for a one-year term. This contract expires by October 31, 2009. SoCalGas is required to provide notice of its renewal intentions to NOVA and Foothills by October 31, 2008.

The table below describes contract information that SoCalGas seeks Commission approval to continue:

SoCalGas requests the Commission to approve the one-year continuation of the above contracts by approving this Expedited Advice Letter as promptly as possible.

Protest

Anyone may protest this Expedited Advice Letter to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and received within 10 days of the date this Expedited Advice Letter was filed with the Commission. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
