Subject: Cross-Over Rate for March 2009

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment B.

Purpose

This routine monthly filing revises the listed tariff rate schedules showing the Cross-Over Rate for applicable residential and core commercial and industrial customers for March 2009, as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission) approval of SoCalGas' Advice No. (AL) 3188-A on September 4, 2003, by Resolution G-3351. AL 3188-A was filed pursuant to Commission Decision (D.) 02-08-065 issued on August 22, 2002, authorizing SoCalGas to implement revised uniform rules for noncore customers requesting core service, and core customers with an annual consumption over 50,000 therms who elect to switch from a Core Aggregation Transportation (CAT) marketer to utility procurement service.

Background

The Cross-Over Rate, as set forth in Schedule No. G-CP will be the higher of 1) the posted monthly core procurement rate or 2) an Adjusted California Border Price. The Border Price adjustment will reflect the fact that interstate transportation costs are included in the core transportation rate, as opposed to the core procurement rate, and therefore must be removed from the Border Price in order to make for a proper comparison (and to avoid charging cross-over customers twice for interstate transportation). Similarly, the core procurement rate does not include intrastate backbone costs which are also a component of the core transportation rate.

The Border Price is equal to the average of the first of the month "Southern Cal Border Avg." index from Natural Gas Intelligence and the "Bid Week, California-South, Delivered to Pipeline" index from Natural Gas Week. The Adjusted Border Price is equal to the Border Price less the currently authorized core interstate capacity costs included in core transportation rates.

This Cross-Over Rate will be applicable for the first 12 months of service for: (1) customers who transfer from noncore service to core procurement service, except the following customers: a) noncore customers who have been served under Schedule No. G-CS since January 1, 2001, or b) noncore customers who have been disqualified from noncore service and are required to return to core service; (2) non-residential core transportation customers who consumed over 50,000 therms in the last 12 months, unless such customer was returned to utility procurement because their gas supplier is no longer doing any business in California, or (3) non-residential core transportation customers with annual consumption over 50,000 therms who return to core procurement service and switch back to transportation only service within 90 days.

The Cross-Over Rate will be filed on or before the 9th calendar day of each month, to be effective the 10th calendar day of each month.

Requested Rate Revision

The Cross-Over Rate for March 2009 is 36.491 cents per therm, which is the same as the Core Procurement rate as filed by AL 3968 on February 27, 2009. The work paper showing the calculation of the Cross-Over Rate is incorporated herein as Attachment C.

Protest

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date of this Advice Letter. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
