Subject: January 1, 2010 Consolidated Rate Update

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to SoCalGas' tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment B, to be effective January 1, 2010.

Purpose

This filing consolidates SoCalGas' rate adjustments authorized by the Commission pursuant to decisions and advice letters effective January 1, 2010, which state: "SoCalGas will file an advice letter consolidating all Commission-authorized changes in its revenue requirements, and the related changes to its rates, at least three days prior to the January 1, 2010 effective date of such rates, including an adjustment for the Sempra-wide common electric generation rate".

Information

This advice letter implements the rate adjustments requested by compliance Advice Nos. (AL) 3890, 3986, 4025-A, 4035 and 4036, and Decision Nos. (D.) 08-07-046 and D.09-12-045.

Incentive Awards and Shareable Earnings

D.08-07-046 adopted, among other things, the Settlement Agreements regarding SoCalGas' revenue requirements for its Test Year 2008 General Rate Case and post-test year ratemaking and incentive proposals. Effective January 1, 2008, SoCalGas is subject to the performance incentive for employee safety. Under the 2004 Cost of Service Phase II D.05-03-023, SoCalGas had specific annual performance measures that allowed for rewards and penalties and earnings sharing between shareholders and ratepayers. Year 2007 was the final year covered by this decision. AL 3862 was filed May 1, 2008, to detail the awards and earnings sharing for 2007 and the associated revenue requirement

was reflected in rates starting on January 1, 2009. As a result of removing the 2007 PBR shareable earnings adjustment and the associated shareholder awards for performance from 2009 rates, rates for 2010 will increase by a net \$22.1 million.

Surcharge to CARE Transportation Rates

On November 9, 2009, SoCalGas filed AL 4036 in compliance with OP 3 of D.05-11-027 dated November 18, 2005, and AL 3561 dated December 10, 2005 and approved January 7, 2006, which established the necessary procedures for allocating to SoCalGas' California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) procurement customers the well work costs associated with maintaining the deliverability capability at the Aliso and Goleta storage fields as a result of releasing the cushion gas to CARE customers pursuant to D.05-11-027. The base margin revenue requirement related to the capital project for Year 2010 is approximately \$2.421 million, a decrease of \$0.248 million compared to the 2009 revenue requirement used to establish the 2009 surcharge rate.

As authorized by AL 4036 and approved by letter dated December 10, 2009 for rates effective January 1, 2010, SoCalGas implements a surcharge rate of 0.399 cents/therm, as reflected in the revised tariffs in Attachment B, to recover the revenue requirement of \$2.421 million related to Year 2010 associated with the capital project from CARE customers.

Annual Update of Regulatory Account Balances

SoCalGas AL 4025-A, dated October 16, 2009, and approved by letter dated November 30, 2009 implements the annual update of regulatory account balances for amortization in 2010 rates, and complies with the longstanding practice of updating SoCalGas' revenue requirement for projected year-end regulatory account balances as established in OP 2 of D.94-12-052. AL 4025-A requests an increase of \$67.8 million and a decrease of \$8.6 million in core and noncore customers' transportation revenue requirements, respectively, for a net increase of \$59.2 million. In addition, AL 4025-A requests a decrease in the revenue requirement for Firm Access Rights of \$7.5 million which results in a decrease in the FAR rate from \$0.05 decatherm per day to \$0.04284 decatherm per day effective January 1, 2010.

GRC Post-Test Year Rate Adjustment for 2010

Pursuant to D. 08-07-046, 2008 General Rate Case (GRC), on August 11, 2008, SoCalGas filed AL 3890 to revise, among other things, Preliminary Statement Part XI, Performance Based Regulation, to establish the authorized annual revenue requirement change for attrition years subsequent to the post-test year 2008. For 2010, SoCalGas' annual revenue requirement will increase by \$51.9 million (i.e., \$51.0 million plus franchise fees and uncollectibles). AL 3890 was approved by letter dated October 6, 2008.

CAT Transmission Charges, excluding NGV, include a 0.073 cents per therm credit to amortize an over collection in the FERC Settlement Proceeds Memorandum Account in 2010 as authorized in Advice No. 4025-A approved on November 30, 2009. The applicable tariffs as shown in Attachment B have been

revised accordingly.

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On Bill Financing (OBF) Rate Adjustment for 2010

SoCalGas AL 4035, dated November 6, 2009, revises SoCalGas' rates to establish the OBF loan pool for the initial year of the 2010-2012 energy efficiency program cycle effective January 1, 2010, pursuant to D.09-09-047, dated September 24, 2009. As authorized by AL 4035, SoCalGas' revenue requirement will increase by \$1.526 million (i.e., \$1.5 million plus franchise fees and uncollectibles) for the initial year of the three-year energy efficiency program cycle to cover existing OBF loans and new loans made in 2010.

Energy Efficiency Incentive

Pursuant to D.09-12-045, the Commission authorized SoCalGas \$2.111 million for its second installment of interim 2006-2008 incentive earnings for energy efficiency savings achieved under its energy efficiency programs. The decision also adopts a schedule and process for a final true-up of 2006-2008 incentive payments to be completed by year-end 2010. The second installment was not included in the forecasted Reward and Penalties Balancing Account (RPBA) balance filed in connection with SoCalGas' Annual Regulatory Account Balance Update Filing (AL 4025-A). The second installment of incentive earnings was recorded to the RPBA in December 2009. Accordingly, for 2010, SoCalGas' revenue requirement will increase by an additional \$2.147 million (including FF&U) to reflect the recovery of the second installment incentive payment in rates effective January 1, 2010.

The revenue requirement below also includes a decrease in the Sempra-wide EG adjustment of \$0.221 million and an increase in the system integration adjustment of \$0.813 million. The system integration adjustment ensures that customers of SoCalGas and SDG&E pay for the combined transmission costs of both utilities pursuant to D.06-04-033 and AL 3771. All rate changes are filed to be effective concurrently with the SDG&E consolidated gas transportation rates to equalize the Sempra-wide EG rate effective January 1, 2010.

Included with this filing are a combined Summary of Annual Gas Transportation Revenues (Attachment C) and a table that summarizes the above mentioned components of the change in revenue requirement (Attachment D).
