Subject: Supplement: Elimination of the California Solar Initiative Balancing Account (CSIBA) and Transfer of the Remaining Balance to Self-Generation Program Memorandum Account (SGPMA)

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for approval with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to its Preliminary Statement Part V, Description of Regulatory Accounts – Balancing, as shown on Attachment B.

Purpose

This supplement complies with the direction of the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA), to replace in its entirety Advice No. (AL) 4094 filed on March 29, 2010. In accordance with Decision (D.) 06-12-033 and the direction of the DRA, this filing transfers the remaining balance of unspent 2006 funds (\$25,471,138, plus interest accrued for March and subsequent months up until the transfer date) in the CSIBA to the SGPMA to be used for future Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) expenditures and eliminates the CSIBA as it is no longer needed.

Background

Pursuant to D.05-12-044, the Commission authorized increased funding for California utilities by \$300 million in 2006 for solar photovoltaic (PV) technologies that were currently part of the SGIP. The California Solar Initiative (CSI) was established in response to a policy proclamation by the Governor favoring solar development and strong interest by the State Legislature in an expanded solar incentives program in California. Pursuant to D.05-12-044, SoCalGas incorporated the annual CSI revenue requirement in 2006 rates and requested modification to its SGPMA to begin recording the authorized annual revenue requirement associated with the CSI program¹.

¹ SoCalGas filed the rate adjustment in Advice No. 3570 on December 28, 2005 which the Commission approved on March 7, 2006. SoCalGas filed changes to the SGPMA in Advice No. 3572 on December 29, 2005 which the Commission approved effective January 28, 2006.

On January 12, 2006, the Commission issued D.06-01-024 which established additional policies and program elements designed to promote solar development and provided additional funding of \$2.5 billion over the next ten years. The decision authorized the utilities to establish a separate regulatory account to track CSI revenue requirements and to collect the funds concurrent with program spending during each year. Consequently, SoCalGas established the CSIBA to track PV incentives and corresponding revenue requirements beginning January 1, 2007². However, on August 21, 2006, Senate Bill (SB) 1 was passed which mandated the exclusion of gas ratepayer funding for CSI activities on and after January 1, 2007. Consistent with SB 1 and D.06-08-028, SoCalGas revised its CSIBA to only record the revenue requirement and related PV incentives paid as part of SGIP for the year 2006³.

Elimination of the CSIBA and Transfer of the Remaining Balance

D.06-12-033, which modified D.06-01-024 to comply with SB 1, also mandated that SoCalGas should transfer any unspent 2006 PV funds to its SGPMA to be used for future SGIP program expenditures. As of February 28, 2010, SoCalGas has completed payment on all PV-technology SGIP projects and plans to transfer the remaining CSIBA balance to the SGPMA. With this transfer, the CSIBA is no longer required and will be eliminated.

Protests

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date of this Advice Letter, which is May 10, 2010. There is no restriction on who may file a protest. Balancing accounts are those regulatory accounts where authorized expenses are compared with revenues from rates designed to recover those expenses. The resulting under or overcollection, plus interest calculated in the manner described in Preliminary Statement, Part I, is recorded on the Utility's financial statements as an asset or liability, which is owed from or due to the ratepayers. Balances in balancing accounts are to be amortized in rates.
