Subject: Self Generation Incentive Program Fund Reallocation Request

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) this advice letter requesting authority to reallocate Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) funds described in Decision (D.) 01-03-073 and addressed by President Peevey in his Assigned Commissioner's Ruling Directing Temporary Suspension of Accepting Customer Reservation Requests Under the Self-Generation Incentive Program (ACR), dated February 10, 2011.

<u>Purpose</u>

This filing requests Commission authority to allow SoCalGas to reallocate SGIP budget dollars from the Level 2 Renewable category to the Level 3 Non-Renewable category. As discussed below, this reallocation is consistent with the Commission's direction, will optimize the amount of new self-generation capacity installed for suspended year 2010 projects, and will avoid the need for a lottery to ration limited SGIP funds.

Background

On March 27, 2001, the Commission issued D.01-03-073 adopting new utility programs to reduce demand for electricity through load control and distributed self-generation initiatives. Furthermore, D.01-03-073 requires the program administrators to seek approval through advice letter prior to shifting funds from a renewable category (Level 2) into a non-renewable category (Level 3) (D.01-03-073, pp. 21). This advice letter seeks such approval.

On December 22, 2010, PG&E, on behalf of the four SGIP Program Administrators (PAs)¹, filed a joint motion to immediately and temporarily suspend the SGIP so as to protect funds for the 2011 program year.

¹ SGIP PAs are SoCalGas, Pacific Gas & Electric, Southern California Edison, and the California Center for Sustainable Energy.

On February 10, 2011, President Peevey issued the ACR directing the PAs to process the 2010 projects that were suspended since December 22, 2010 as follows:

"Consistent with existing Commission decisions, the PAs should continue to process all applications received in 2010, and shift funds from their Level 3 budgets to their Level 2 budgets as necessary and as allowed under the program rules. If a PA does not have sufficient funds to provide reservations for all of the applications received in 2010, it should allocate reservations to applications in the order received, subject to the condition that Level 2 funds shall not be used to provide reservations for Level 3 projects. In the event that a PA's incentive budget for either level would be oversubscribed by applications received on the same date, the PA should consult with the Energy Division staff to establish and conduct a lottery or devise another appropriate process to allocate reservations." (ACR at p.6-7)

Reason for Request to Shift SGIP Funds from Level 2 to Level 3

Under the SGIP rules, PAs must gain Commission approval before shifting monies from Level 2 to Level 3. The purpose of this advice letter is to request permission to shift \$2,692,901 in Level 2 dollars to Level 3. These monies are needed to help fund six SGIP applications totaling 3.28 MW of distributed generation capacity that were received on December 31, 2010.

Currently, SoCalGas has Level 3 funds totaling \$5.960 million. This includes 2010 funds that rolled over, and year 2011 authorized budget. SoCalGas currently has \$8.653 million in Level 3 projects that were received on December 31, 2010. As a result, without a shift of funds, SoCalGas would be oversubscribed in Level 3 by \$2.693 million.

Pursuant to the ACR, SoCalGas consulted with Energy Division and agreed that this instant advice letter was appropriate so as to fully fund all Level 3 projects received in 2010 and to avoid the need for a lottery.

After funding all 2010 projects and completing this shift of funds, SoCalGas' Level 2 budget will have a balance of \$7.282 million and zero in Levels 2 and 3, respectively. This includes year 2011 funds for incentives. The following table summarizes the instant proposal.

Protest
