Subject: January 1, 2015 Consolidated Rate Update

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment A, to be effective January 1, 2015.

Purpose

This filing consolidates SoCalGas' rate adjustments authorized by the Commission pursuant to decisions and advice letters effective January 1, 2015, which state: "SoCalGas will file an advice letter consolidating all Commission-authorized changes in its revenue requirements, and the related changes to its rates, at least three days prior to the January 1, 2015 effective date of such rates, including an adjustment for the Sempra-wide common electric generation rate".

Information

This advice letter implements the rate adjustments requested by compliance Advice No. (AL) 4700, Regulatory Account Update; AL 4110, Advanced Metering Infrastructure Revenue Requirement; Decision (D.) 13-05-010, General Rate Case (GRC) Post-Test Year Attrition; D.10-04-034, Honor Rancho Storage; D.14-12-033, Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) extension; and Resolution G-3497, 2012 and 2013 Energy Efficiency Incentives Awards.

Annual Update of Regulatory Account Balances - AL 4700

SoCalGas' AL 4700, dated October 15, 2014, and approved by letter dated December 17, 2014, implemented the annual update of regulatory account balances for amortization in 2015 rates, and complied with the longstanding practice of updating SoCalGas' revenue requirement for projected year-end regulatory account balances as authorized in

D.14-06-007, SoCalGas' Triennial Cost Allocation Proceeding (TCAP). AL 4700 proposed an \$84.6 million increase and \$9.4 million increase in SoCalGas' transportation revenue requirement for core and noncore customers, respectively, resulting in a total increase of \$94.0 million (with Franchise Fees & Uncollectibles (FF&U)). In addition, AL 4700 proposed a decrease in the revenue requirement for Backbone Transportation Service (BTS) of \$2.6 million (with FF&U) but with updating the BTS Demand from 2,923,646 dth/day to 2,809,327 dth/day, the BTS rate will increase from \$0.15406 dth/day to \$0.15777 dth/day.

Moreover, AL 4700 revised SoCalGas' revenue requirement for Company-Use (CU) Fuel and Unaccounted For (UAF) Gas costs. For 2015, SoCalGas forecasted an average gas price of \$4.28/MMBtu, an increase of \$0.30/MMBtu from the \$3.98/MMBtu currently in rates, resulting in an increase in the authorized costs for CU Fuel and UAF Gas of \$2.5 million (with FF&U) compared to the present revenue requirement.

Advance Metering Infrastructure (AMI) Revenue Requirement for 2015 - AL 4110

Pursuant to D.10-04-027, SoCalGas' AMI Decision, SoCalGas filed AL 4110 which, among other things, updated the AMI revenue requirement to reflect the total costs and benefits as adopted in D.10-04-027 to be collected in rates beginning on January 1, 2012 and continuing through December 31, 2017. For 2015, SoCalGas' annual revenue requirement will increase by \$14.9 million (\$14.7 million without FF&U). The total revenue requirement for AMI for 2015 will be \$115.6 million (\$113.6 million without FF&U). AL 4110 was approved by letter dated August 4, 2010.

2012 General Rate Case (GRC) Post-Test Year Attrition - D.13-05-010

SoCalGas is implementing its 2015 post-test year attrition adjustment of 2.75%, or \$53.2 million (\$52.3 million without FF&U), which was authorized by ordering paragraph 4 of D.13-05-010.

Addition of 1 BCF Storage Inventory - D.10-04-034

Pursuant to D.10-04-034, the Commission's Decision Addressing Application of SoCalGas to Amend Its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the Honor Rancho Natural Gas Storage Facility, unbundled storage inventory will increase by 1.0 BCF to 50.9 BCF in 2015 rates. Likewise, total storage inventory increases by 1.0 BCF to 138.1 BCF. The attached rates reflect these changes.

Self-Generation Incentive Program Extension – D.14-12-033

On June 20, 2014, the Governor signed Senate Bill 861, which authorized a five-year extension for the Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP). Commissioner Peevey issued a ruling on September 23, 2014, regarding the implementation of Senate Bill 861 to extend the SGIP in the Distributed Generation (DG) OIR. SoCalGas is authorized, in D.14-12-033, approved on December 18, 2014, to collect \$8.1 million, (\$8.0 million without FF&U), effective January 1, 2015.

2012 and 2013 Energy Efficiency Incentive Awards – Resolution G-3497

Pursuant to D.12-12-032 and D.13-09-023, the 2012 and 2013 energy efficiency incentive awards decisions, SoCalGas filed AL 4661. Resolution G-3497, which addressed AL 4661, calculated an award of \$5.98 million (\$5.87 million without FF&U). Resolution G-3497 was approved on December 18, 2014.

Other Revenue Requirement Adjustments

The revenue requirement below also includes an increase in the Sempra-wide NGV adjustment of \$0.8 million, a decrease in the Sempra-wide EG adjustment of \$0.5 million, and a decrease in the Transmission Level Service (TLS) adjustment of \$1.6 million. All rate changes are filed to be effective concurrently with the SDG&E's consolidated gas transportation rates to equalize the Sempra-wide NGV, EG and TLS rates effective January 1, 2015.

Included with this filing are a combined Summary of Annual Gas Transportation Revenues (Attachment B) and a table that summarizes the above mentioned components of the change in revenue requirement (Attachment C).

COST ALLOCATION AND REVENUE REQUIREMENT

A. TRIENNIAL COST ALLOCATION PROCEEDING:

1. In a Triennial Cost Allocation Proceeding (TCAP), the Utility shall file and the Commission shall authorize an allocation of the Utility's revenue requirement and reallocation of balancing account balances among customer classes, the rates for core customers and the rates for noncore customers.
2. Other decisions by the Commission may require rate revisions at times other than those specified herein.

B. REVENUE REQUIREMENT:

The Utility's revenue requirement consists of the sum total of all estimated costs to provide service for the forecast period. Rates will be established to recover all items in the Revenue Requirement. The components of the revenue requirement are as follows:

1. GAS MARGIN

This amount shall be the total annual base revenues authorized by the Commission. The authorized gas margin pursuant to SoCalGas Advice No. 4730, effective January 1, 2015, is \$1,996,480,000. Of the total revenues, \$1,777,408,000 is allocated to the core market and \$219,072,000 is allocated to the noncore market.

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2. REGULATORY ACCOUNTS

Included below are the major balancing accounts. For a complete listing of all regulatory accounts, please refer to Preliminary Statement, Parts V, VI, and VII.

a. CORE FIXED COST ACCOUNT (CFCA) BALANCE

The revenue requirement shall include an amortization of the forecasted revision-date balance in the CFCA based on the latest data available. This amortization will be reflected in rates for core customers only. (See Preliminary Statement, Part V for a description of the CFCA.)

b. NONCORE FIXED COST ACCOUNT (NFCA) BALANCE

The revenue requirement is the amortization of the forecasted revision-date balance in the NFCA based on the latest data available. This amortization will be reflected in rates for noncore customers only. (See Preliminary Statement, Part V for a description of the NFCA.)

2. Class Average Long Run Marginal Cost (LRMC) Floor Rates

- a. D.98-01-040, Finding of Fact No. 5, allows SoCalGas the option to discount core transportation rates down to a LRMC floor rate; however, SoCalGas may not discount the cost of gas. For this program, the LRMC floor rate includes the following components: customer related, medium-pressure distribution, high-pressure distribution, transmission, seasonal storage, load balancing, company use transmission, unaccounted for gas, and interstate pipeline demand charges. In addition to these components, the full transportation rate includes the following components: non-marginal costs in base margin, PITCO/POPCO transition costs, core averaging costs, and other exclusion costs.
- b. The following table lists the full transportation rates authorized by D.14-06-007, and the class average LRMC floor rates authorized by D.98-01-040. LRMC Floor Rates were updated with new values established in D.00-04-060, D.01-12-018, and SoCalGas Advice No. 4053, effective January 1, 2010. Full Transportation Rates are updated with new values established in D.14-06-007 and Advice No. 4730 effective January 1, 2015. The floor rates represent the lowest possible average annual rate by class under which SoCalGas can serve gas. These rates represent a starting point for the program and, pursuant to Commission order, may be modified in future rate proceedings.

The approved Monthly Minimum Charge for each Customer shall apply only when the charge exceeds the total reservation and volumetric transportation charges for GT-TLS service and shall be applied in lieu of the total reservation and volumetric transportation charges.
