**Subject: June 2019 Buy-Back Rates** 

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment A.

#### **Purpose**

This routine monthly submittal updates the Buy-Back Rates in Schedule No. G-IMB for June 2019.

#### **Background**

As authorized in Schedule No. G-IMB - Transportation Imbalance Service, the Buy-Back Rates are established effective the last day of each month.

The Buy-Back Rates will be the lower of 1) the lowest incremental cost of gas purchased by the Utility during the month the imbalance was incurred; or 2) 50% of the applicable Adjusted Core Procurement Charge, G-CPA, set forth in Schedule No. G-CP, during the month such excess imbalance was incurred.

#### Information

During the month of June, the lowest incremental cost of gas, which is 3.000 cents per therm, is lower than 50% of the Adjusted Core Procurement Charge, G-CPA. Therefore, the Buy-Back Rates for June 2019 are being revised accordingly. The work paper showing details of the calculation of these rates is incorporated herein as Attachment B.

The new rates are reflected in the attached Schedule No. G-IMB tariff sheets. Pursuant to Resolution G-3316, the June 2019 Standby Procurement Charges will be submitted by a separate Advice Letter at least one day prior to July 25, 2019.

#### **Protest**

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date of this Advice Letter, which is July 18, 2019. The Standby Procurement Charge is posted at least one day in advance of each corresponding imbalance trading period for noncore/wholesale and core transport agents (CTAs). It is calculated at 150% of the highest daily border price index at the Southern California border beginning on the first day of the month that the imbalance is created to five days prior to the start of each corresponding imbalance trading period plus a Brokerage Fee of  $0.266\phi$  per therm for noncore retail service and all wholesale service, and  $0.208\phi$  per therm for core retail service. The highest daily border price index is an average of the highest prices from "Natural Gas Intelligence's (NGI's) Daily Gas Price Index – Southern California Border Average" and "SNL Energy's Daily Indices – SoCal Border."

If the incremental cost of gas is the basis for the Standby or Buy-Back Rates, the Utility will provide CPUC the necessary work papers for such cost. Such documentation will be provided under confidentiality pursuant to General Order 66-C and Section 583 of the Public Utilities Code.

#### Daily Balancing Standby Rates

When a Stage 5 Low Operational Flow Order (Low OFO) or Emergency Flow Order (EFO) is declared, quantities not in compliance with the daily imbalance tolerance are purchased at the daily balancing standby rate. When a curtailment is declared, quantities determined by the Utility to be in violation of curtailment are charged (not purchased) at the daily balancing standby rate. There will be no commodity transfer to the curtailed customer in return for receiving this charge. The daily balancing standby rate is not applicable to High OFOs.

# RATE CALCULATION WORKPAPER BASED ON ADVICE NO. 5473 ADJUSTED CORE PROCUREMENT CHARGE SUBMITTAL EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2019

#### **Adjusted Core Procurement Charge:**

Retail G-CPA: 24.614  $\phi$  per therm (WACOG: 24.194  $\phi$  + Franchise and Uncollectibles: 0.420  $\phi$  or [ 1.7370% \* 24.194  $\phi$  ] )

Wholesale G-CPA: 24.541 ¢ per therm (WACOG: 24.194 ¢ + Franchise: 0.347 ¢ or [ 1.4339% \* 24.194 ¢ ] )

Lowest incremental cost of gas purchased during June 2019 is 3.000 cents/therm, which is lower than the following:

#### **GIMB Buy-Back Rates**

**BR-R** = 50% of Retail G-CPA: 50% \* 24.614 cents/therm = **12.307** cents/therm

**BR-W** = 50% of Wholesale G-CPA: 50% \* 24.541 cents/therm = **12.271** cents/therm

Therefore: **BR-R** and **BR-W** = **3.000** cents/therm
