Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment A.

#### <u>Purpose</u>

This routine submittal revises the listed tariff rate schedules showing the Cross-Over Rate for applicable residential and core commercial and industrial customers for April 2022 as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission or CPUC) approval of SoCalGas' Advice No. (AL) 3188-A on September 4, 2003, by Resolution G-3351. AL 3188-A was submitted pursuant to Commission Decision (D.) 02-08-065 dated August 22, 2002, authorizing SoCalGas to implement revised uniform rules for noncore customers requesting core service, and core customers with an annual consumption over 50,000 therms who elect to switch from a Core Aggregation Transportation (CAT) marketer to utility procurement service.

#### Background

The Cross-Over Rate, as set forth in Schedule No. G-CP is comprised of the higher of 1) the posted monthly core procurement rate, less authorized franchise fees and uncollectible expenses (see the "Adjusted Core Procurement Cost of Gas" per therm calculation in Attachment B which establishes this value); or 2) the Adjusted California Border Price Index (also included in Attachment B), which consists of the California Border Price<sup>1</sup> and the Backbone Transportation Service (BTS) Reservation Charge.<sup>2</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The (un-adjusted) California Border Price is equal to the average of the first of the month "Southern Cal Border Avg." index from Natural Gas Intelligence and the "Southern California Gas Co., California" index from Inside FERC. The Adjusted Border Price is equal to the Border Price, plus BTS charges as described in D.11-04-032.

The authorized franchise fees and uncollectible expenses charge, and the authorized core brokerage fee charge are then added to the chosen rate.

This Cross-Over Rate will be applicable for the first 12 months of service for: (1) customers who transfer from noncore service to core procurement service, except the following customers: a) noncore customers who have been served under Schedule No. G-CS since January 1, 2001, or b) noncore customers who have been disqualified from noncore service and are required to return to core service; (2) non-residential core transportation customers who consumed over 50,000 therms in the last 12 months, unless such customer was returned to utility procurement because its gas supplier is no longer doing any business in California; or (3) non-residential core transportation customers with annual consumption over 50,000 therms who return to core procurement service and switch back to transportation only service within 90 days.

The Cross-Over Rate will be submitted on or before the 9<sup>th</sup> calendar day of each month, to be effective the 10<sup>th</sup> calendar day of each month.

### Requested Rate Revision

The Cross-Over Rate for April 2022 is 58.143 cents per therm, which is the same as the Core Procurement rate, as submitted by AL 5955 on March 31, 2022. The work paper showing the calculation of the Cross-Over Rate is incorporated herein as Attachment B.
