<u>Subject</u>: Additional Hazardous Substance Site to Include in SoCalGas's Hazardous Substance Cost Recovery Account

<u>Purpose</u>

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby requests approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to include the site located at 115 North New Hampshire Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90004 (Site) in the Hazardous Substance Cost Recovery Account (HSCRA) within SoCalGas's Preliminary Statement Part V (Regulatory Accounts – Balancing) in compliance with Decision No. (D.) 94-05-020. This is the site of a hazardous substance clean-up.

Background

D.94-05-020 requires California utilities to submit an advice letter to include additional sites not originally identified for treatment within the Hazardous Substance
Mechanism. For each site, the advice letter shall list: 1) the name of the site, 2) the location of the site; 3) the source, nature and approximate date of the contamination;
4) utility operations (historical and current) at the site, if any; and 5) environmental agency and oversight regarding the site, if any.

In addition, D.96-07-016 requires utilities to demonstrate that: 1) clean-up costs for which recovery is being sought are not being recovered through base rates or through any other recovery procedure; and 2) all of the costs for which recovery is being sought are hazardous waste clean-up costs (including insurance costs) found appropriate for recovery in the Hazardous Substance Clean-up Cost Recovery Collaborative Report, dated November 19, 1993 (Collaborative Report). SoCalGas owns and maintains natural gas distribution lines around the Site.

Required Information

The relevant information for the Site is as follows:

• Site Name and Location

115 N. New Hampshire Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90004.

• Source, Nature, and Approximate Date of Contamination

On July 28, 2022, during removal of a non-SoCalGas standard regulator in line with the master gas meter in the basement of the residential building at the Site, SoCalGas employees identified elemental mercury released from the equipment onto the concrete basement floor. SoCalGas immediately stopped work and commenced removal of mercury from the concrete. After an initial removal of all visible mercury, residual mercury was detected on the basement floor using a mercury detecting instrument. SoCalGas thereafter engaged hazardous substances removal contractors to undertake a thorough remediation of the site, which included treatment with a solution to bind and remove residual mercury, vacuuming, heating and ventilation, and removal and replacement of impacted concrete.

• Utility Operations (Historical and Current) at the Site

An active natural gas distribution line owned and operated by SoCalGas has historically served and currently serves the apartment building at the Site.

• Environmental Agency Actions and Oversight

There is no agency involvement with this property. The amount of mercury released was determined to be below the levels requiring agency oversight.

Nature of Costs

The remediation costs that SoCalGas is seeking to recover through the procedure are not being recovered through base rates or through any other recovery procedure. All clean-up costs included by SoCalGas in the procedure are hazardous and non-hazardous waste clean-up costs found appropriate for recovery in the Collaborative Report.

Protest

Anyone may protest this advice letter to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be submitted electronically and must be received within 20 days after the date of this advice letter, which is
