**Subject: Establishment of the Angeles Link Memorandum Account (ALMA)
Pursuant to Decision (D.) 22-12-055**

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) revisions to its Preliminary Statement Part VI, Memorandum Accounts, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown on Attachment A.

Purpose

In compliance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 2 of D.22-12-055, this Advice Letter (AL) establishes the Angeles Link Memorandum Account (ALMA) to record eligible costs associated with developing the Angeles Link Project, including a sub-account to record Phase One costs and activities. Pursuant to D.22-12-055, SoCalGas is authorized at this time to record costs to conduct Phase One feasibility studies for the Angeles Link Project, a clean hydrogen energy transport system serving the Los Angeles Basin.

Background

SoCalGas filed Application (A.) 22-02-007 seeking CPUC authorization to establish a memorandum account for the purposes of recording the incremental costs necessary to develop a new green hydrogen energy transport system called the Angeles Link Project (Project). The stated objective of the Project was to develop a green hydrogen energy transport system which would advance the State's clean energy policy objectives of decarbonization and clean air goals by bringing green hydrogen to the Los Angeles Basin as an energy source for hard to electrify industries, electric

generation, and the heavy-duty transportation sector. The Application also stated that the Project could replace certain uses of natural gas supplied by Aliso Canyon.

On December 15, 2022, the CPUC adopted D.22-12-055. This decision granted SoCalGas the authority to establish the ALMA to record the costs of performing Phase One feasibility studies for the Project.¹ The decision found that clean renewable hydrogen has the potential to decarbonize California's and the Los Angeles Basin's energy future and bring economic opportunities and new jobs to the Los Angeles region,² and that clean renewable hydrogen is also one of the few viable carbon-free energy alternatives for the hard-to-electrify industries, electric generation, and the heavy-duty transportation sector.³ The decision further found that the Project would benefit SoCalGas ratepayers who can take service of the clean renewable hydrogen provided through such a project, and replace gas, including that supplied by the Aliso Canyon natural gas storage facility.⁴ Finally, the decision stated that the Project could help position California to receive federal funding through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), which is providing \$8 billion to fund the development of four regional clean hydrogen hubs,⁵ and therefore directed SoCalGas to join other entities that are members of the Alliance for Renewable Clean Hydrogen Energy Systems in support of the State of California in its application for the federal funding through the IIJA prior to receiving authority to record any Phase Two costs, and to study as part of Phase One the feasibility of a localized hydrogen hub solution in the Los Angeles Basin.

SoCalGas was authorized by D.22-12-055 to establish the ALMA to record the costs of performing Phase One feasibility studies for the Project up to an initial cap of \$26 million, subject to certain additional conditions adopted therein.⁶ SoCalGas is authorized to submit a Tier 2 AL with the Commission's Energy Division to increase the \$26 million cap by up to 15% if SoCalGas can demonstrate that such an increase is needed to complete the Phase One feasibility studies and the additional activities ordered in this decision.⁷ SoCalGas is not authorized to recover in rates any Project costs at this time – rather, SoCalGas is ordered to file a separate application for cost recovery. Finally, the decision adopts an application process for SoCalGas to request Commission authority to record costs for Phase Two activities in the ALMA, if SoCalGas chooses to do so.⁸

Establishment of the ALMA

In compliance with OP 2 of D.22-12-055, SoCalGas is establishing the ALMA to record eligible costs associated with developing the Project, including a sub-account to record Phase One costs and activities. The proposed preliminary statement is included as Attachment A.

Anyone may protest this AL to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be submitted electronically and must be received within 20 days after the date of this AL, which is January 10, 2023. PRELIMINARY STATEMENT - PART VI - MEMORANDUM ACCOUNTS
ANGELES LINK MEMORANDUM ACCOUNT (ALMA)

Sheet 1

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1. Purpose

The ALMA is an interest-bearing memorandum account recorded on SoCalGas' financial statements. Pursuant to Decision (D.) 22-12-055, the purpose of the ALMA is to record incremental costs associated with the Angeles Link Project, which would develop an integrated hydrogen energy transport system. D.22-12-055 also authorized the creation of a Phase One Subaccount. Additional phases of the Angeles Link Project may be added for recording to the ALMA by filing additional Applications for Commission approval.

The ALMA shall consist of the following subaccount(s):

- 1) The Phase One Subaccount will record the incremental costs of performing Phase One feasibility studies for the Angeles Link Project, subject to certain enumerated conditions. Phase One costs are initially capped at \$26 million, which may be increased by up to 15% after submission and subsequent approval of a Tier 2 Advice Letter.

2. Applicability

The ALMA shall apply to all customers except those specifically excluded by the Commission.

3. Rates

See Disposition Section.

4. Phase One Subaccount – Accounting Procedures

SoCalGas maintains this account by recording entries at the end of each month, net of applicable FF&U, as follows:

- a) A debit entry equal to the actual operations and maintenance (O&M) costs and capital-related costs (i.e., depreciation, return and taxes) associated with Phase One feasibility studies for the Angeles Link Project;
- b) An entry to amortize the account balance as authorized by the Commission; and
- c) An entry equal to interest on the average of the balance in the account during the month, calculated in the manner described in Preliminary Statement, Part I, J.

5. Disposition

SoCalGas will file an application in order to request authority to recover the costs in the Phase One Subaccount of the ALMA.
