Purpose

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for approval with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) the early closure of the Multifamily Space and Water Heating Controls program (SCG 3888) from SoCalGas's Energy Efficiency (EE) Portfolio.

Background

On January 17, 2018, the Commission issued Decision (D.)18-01-004, requiring California Investor-Owned Utilities (IOUs) to transition to no less than 25 percent third-party¹ designed and implemented energy efficiency portfolios by December 31, 2019, 40 percent by December 31, 2020, and 60 percent by December 31, 2022.² D.18-01-004 further outlined the process for conducting third-party solicitations, including the requirement to submit a Tier 2 advice letter for any contracts of greater than \$5 million or three years in length.³ In D.21-05-031, the Commission reiterated that a Tier 2 advice letter is required for the opening of new programs and the closure of existing programs and requested that "Commission staff will develop a process and content checklist of these [program closure] requirements and post them to our website prior to December 31, 2021."

In accordance with D.18-01-004, SoCalGas began solicitations for multifamily programs by releasing the Residential Multifamily Request for Abstract (RFA) on November 26, 2018 with a proposal due date of January 7, 2019. Of the 13 RFA submissions, five bidders were selected and requested to submit Requests for Proposals (RFPs) on July 31, 2019, with a submission due date of November 11, 2019. On January 22, 2020, the SoCalGas solicitation committee selected EnergX Controls Inc. to implement the Multifamily Space and Water Heating Controls program and an agreement was signed on December 23, 2020. No advice letter was required as the budget was below the \$5 million dollar threshold for third-party solicitations and the agreement terms between SoCalGas and EnergX Controls Inc. did not exceed 3 years.

Discussion

Program Description

The Multifamily Space and Water Heating Controls program aimed at providing a simple, nocost avenue to maximizing the efficiency of dual function central water heaters in multifamily properties throughout the SoCalGas service territory. Narrow in scope by design, the program intended to optimize these existing systems through the direct installation of dual set point controllers and variable frequency devices.

Justification for Closure

As a result of COVID-19's market impacts, the program faced increased costs and shipping times to procure measure equipment, as well as increased costs to install measure equipment. These market impacts have hindered the program's ability to deliver measures to customers in a cost-effective manner. As a result, the program has treated a limited number of properties in 2021 with no additional treatments occurring in 2022. In addition, the dual set point controller measure package expired on 12/31/2022, which has largely invalidated the program's design.

For these reasons, EnergX Controls Inc. and SoCalGas have mutually agreed to sunset the program and terminate the contract. SoCalGas does not anticipate the program's closure will have any impact to ratepayers.

Program Start and Sunset Dates

The program launched on February 22, 2021 and was originally intended to sunset on 12/31/2023.

Contracted Budget and Savings

Table 1 reflects the filed budget, savings, and TRC for the most recent and current program years.

Webinar

Pursuant to Energy Division's checklist for program closures, SoCalGas held a public webinar on March 20, 2023 to provide more information on the requested program closure. The California Energy Efficiency Coordinating Committee (CAEECC) posted notice of this webinar on their website. There are no additional planned changes to the program closure because of the webinar.

Program Replacement Plan

Upon acceptance of this advice letter, SoCalGas will transition funding released from this program's closure to the Multifamily Energy Alliance (MEA) program. The MEA program is a downstream program which provides both rebate and direct install measures to multifamily customers.

The MEA program will utilize the additional funding to continue to serve the multifamily sector, including properties located in Disadvantaged Communities (DAC) or classified as Hard-to-Reach (HTR). The Multifamily Space and Water Heater Controls program will not be resolicited.
